PORT LOCATION

Ships dock at the Brisbane International Cruise Terminal, which is about 20-minute drive from the CBD

Getting Around: As a major city, Brisbane has excellent public transport options, including buses, trains, bikes and ferries. There is a free City Loop bus route (Mon-Fri, 7am-6pm), which arrive every 15-minutes. BRISBANE CBD HIGHLIGHTS

• Queen Street Mall: The main shopping center of Brisbane with over 500 stores.

Brisbane Botanical Gardens: 17-hectare City Botanical Gardens are in the heart of Brisbane on Alice Street, with beautiful waterfront trails and park paths to enjoy.

6km out-of-town, Mount Coot-tha site is 56-hectares, with great views over the CBD and the world's largest collection of Australian native rainforest trees. 6a-6p | Free | 20-minute drive (23km from port)

3 Queensland Museum: The official museum of Queensland state has a collection of more than 1 million items, telling the ever-changing story of the state. 9:30a-5p | Free | 20-minute drive (23km from port)

● Story Bridge Climb: For an adrenaline rush, climb to the heights of the Story Bridge. One of just three bridges in the world to offer such a climb, Story Bridge peaks at 80m above the river and offers inspiring city views from the top. 9a, 3:40p, 4:20p | \$129 | 20-minute drive (23km from port)

● Parliament House: Built in 1868, the Queensland Parliament is the only state legislature in Australia to have just one debating chamber – there is no 'upper' house. No booking is required for tours.

6 Museum of Brisbane: Located on Level 3 of Brisbane City Hall in King George Square. One of the most-admired heritage buildings in the city. Visitors often have the chance to meet local artists-in-residence and meet Aboriginal Australians to learn about local lore and customs.
