### PORT LOCATION

Ships dock at the Cruise Ship Terminal, close to Chinatown and the Latin Quarter. Larger ships dock in the working port and take shuttles to the Cruise Ship Terminal

**Getting Around:** The Tanéo bus network offers a PASS journée (Day Pass) costs 900 XPF and can be purchased from the ticket machine at the bus hub =3. Single-ride tickets can be purchased for 300 XPF onboard the bus 3. There are also tourist trains. Taxis 3 are booked by phone or can be hailed if they are within 100m of a taxi rank

Plage de la Baie des Citrons: The main tourist beach. 8-minute drive (4km from port)

Anse Vata Beach: Just south of Lemon Bay. 10-minute drive (4.5km from port)

**Watersports:** Anse Vata is the windiest beach in Nouméa, so perfect from windsurfing. Paddleboarding, kayaking, and jet skis are also available. 10-minute drive (5km from port)

**Duck Island:** A short boat ride from the beach in Anse Vata Bay, Duck Island is a great spot for snorkeling. 10-minute drive (5km from port) + a boat ride

**Aquarium des Lagons Nouvelle Caledonie:** Between Lemon Bay and Anse Vata, this seafront aquarium has a particularly enthralling room of fluorescent corals.
