Ships dock at the Pago Pago port (a commercial port), a 5-minute walk from the center of town

BEACHES NEAR PAGO PAGO

Two Dollar Beach: Actually costing \$5, this privately run beach is very popular. There is a bar, sun loungers, and places to both swim and snorkel in the sea. Drinks are expensive at around \$12 for cocktails or \$5 for a local beer. 20-minute drive

Fagatogo Local Beach: The closest beach to the port is small, but popular with local families, and bats. Turn left out of the port. Free beach | 10-minute walk

Alega Beach: Good spot for swimming and snorkeling, and if you buy a drink at Tisa's Barefoot Bar, then you don't need to pay the \$5 entrance fee. Entry \$5 | 20-minute walk

SHOPS + MARKETS IN PAGO PAGO

In Fagatogo, there are a couple of markets as well as local shops.

The market is easy to spot, with its blue-and-yellow striped awnings.

The fancy department store is called Forsgren's, and you'll find regular shops in the Fagatogo Square Shopping Center. Away from the main tourist market, you'll also find small stores selling locally-made handicrafts in Pago Plaza.

If you're looking for something customary clothing to buy as a souvenir, the traditional puletasi dress is a matching skirt-and-tunic sets adorned with Samoan designs.

Tauese P.F. Sunia Ocean Center: Features educational exhibits and interactive learning tools to showcase American Samoa's natural resources and promote ocean awareness.

NATURE NEAR PAGO PAGO

National Park of American Samoa: the only US National Park in the Southern Hemisphere. Free to visit, and there is a visitor center. Park features paleotropical rainforests, that are home to rare species including the Flying Megabat, and the rare, endemic Pacific Tree Boa in the depths of the forest. About 4,000 acres of the park is underwater, offshore. <u>Visitor Guide</u> is available online.
