PORT LOCATION

Ships dock at Adelaide's Outer Harbour terminal, which is 23km (14 miles) from the city. 1-hour train to Adelaide City (30-minute drive) or 30-minute train to Port Adelaide suburb (15-minute drive)

Getting Around: Adelaide has a good public transport network, and some form of transportation is required to get to any point of interest from the port. Adelaide Metro operates the city's bus, train and tram services. There is a special Cruise Visitor day ticket (\$10) available at Outer Harbour Station. Outer Harbour station is 200m walk from terminal. Once in the city, CBD trams and some buses are free.

PORT ADELAIDE

National Railway Museum: Australia's largest undercover railway museum with over 100 exhibits representing State, Commonwealth and private railway operators 10a-4:30p | Entry \$17

South Australian Aviation Museum: Aircraft, engines and even rockets – all with a connection to South Australia. 10a-4p | \$15

South Australian Maritime Museum: In the heart of Port Adelaide, South Australia's first heritage precinct. Collection includes ships, a lighthouse and temporary exhibitions. 10a-5p | \$22.50

ADELAIDE CITY

Adelaide Botanic Garden: In the North-East corner of the city, the rose garden of this botanic garden showcases a collection of 5,000 roses. Check out the space-age bicentennial conservatory and Victorian era Santos Museum of Economic Botany on site too. 7:15a-sunset | Free

St Peter's Cathedral: The seat of the Archbishop of Adelaide. Designed by British architect William Butterfield, the cathedral opened in 1877.

St Francis Xavier Cathedral: Named for the patron saint of missionaries and the Church of Australia, St Francis Xavier was the personal patron saint of Adelaide's first bishop, Francis Murphy. This Gothic Revival cathedral took 140 years to complete. 7a-7p | Free
