PORT LOCATION

Ships dock at Station Pier at the Port of Melbourne, which is a 24-minute tram ride from the CBD (#109)

Getting Around: The easiest way to explore Melbourne is by walking and taking the tram for longer journeys around the CBD. In the CBD area, trams are free. To use the public transport system, buy a myki card (\$6) from the tram stop/newsagent in the port area. Android phone users can install the Mobile myki app instead of purchasing a physical card. A daily fare caps at \$10.60

BEST OF MELBOURNE

National Gallery of Victoria: Founded in 1861, this is Australia's oldest and most visited museum, split across two sites: the international art site on St Kilda Road and the Ian Potter Centre, close to Federation Square, specialises in Australian art.

Cooks' Cottage: Talking of immigration... this is an immigrating house! Built in 1755 in Yorkshire, UK, this house - lived in by Captain Cook's parents - was relocated to Melbourne in the 1930s.

Coop's Tower: Once one of the tallest buildings in the city, at the heart of the city's arms trade. Now incorporated into the site of Melbourne Central shopping centre.

FLORA & FAUNA

Melbourne Zoo: Housing over 320 species, this large zoo, 4km north of the CBD, is a popular site to meet Australia's native species (as well as some more exotic residents).

SPORTS IN MELBOURNE

Melbourne Park: Home of the Australian Open Grand Slam tennis tournament, hosted each January. Tours are available to visit the Rod Laver Arena.

Albert Park Lake: Location of the Albert Park Circuit, a street circuit as part of the F1 Australian Grand Prix in March.

Melbourne Cricket Ground: Known locally as The 'G, there are daily tours of the home of Australian cricket.

Australian Sports Museum: Located at Gate Three of the MCG, with loads of memorabilia and displays as well as interactive exhibits. Good fun and an interesting collection. 10a-5p | \$33

OUT OF TOWN

St Kilda: This fun-loving beach neighborhood is 5km from the port, along the beachfront. Over here you'll find street markets, hip cafes and an antique theme park (Luna Park), which opened in 1912 and still runs its original wooden rollercoaster.
