PORT LOCATION

Ships dock in either White Bay (under the Sydney Harbour Bridge) or the Overseas Passenger Terminal (at Circular Quay). When docked at White Bay, a shuttle bus takes you into the city (20-minute drive)

Getting Around: While Sydney is a big city, the central districts are walkable. It is about 2km (30-minute walk) from Darling Harbour to Circular Quay. Public transport includes trains, metro, light-rail, buses, and ferries - all of which can be paid via contactless debit/credit cards. Alternatively, top-up an Opal Card. Daily fares cap at \$17.80 (Mon-Thu) and \$8.90 (Fri-Sun)

CAN'T MISS IN SYDNEY

Sydney Opera House: Arguably the most famous opera house in the world. Iconic and striking, this facility is the site of six theatres. Tours are also available.

Sydney Harbour Bridge: Six million rivets hold this monumental structure together. Walk across it for free (and take amazing photos of the city), or brave the heights and take a Bridge Climb tour to the top. 24 hours | Free (Bridge Climb: \$294)

MUSEUMS & GALLERIES

Art Gallery of New South Wales: The premier art gallery in the State. With a magnificent collection of international works by world-renowned masters. Architecturally impressive too. 10a-5p | Free www.artgallery.nsw.gov.au

Museum of Contemporary Art Australia: For modern art appreciators, this waterfront gallery at the foot of The Rocks (near Circular Quay) is a must-see gallery. 10a-5p | Free

Australian Museum: The oldest museum in Australia and the fifth oldest natural history museum in the world. Internationally respected for natural history and anthropology. 9a-9p (Mon-Wed), 9a-5p (Thu-Sun) | Free

Museum of Sydney: A small-but-mighty museum in the CBD, telling the city's story, with locally relevant exhibitions. 10a-5p | Free

Justice & Police Museum: Sydney grew out of a penal colony, so it should come as no surprise that this museum has more than a few fascinating tales to share. In the CBD, in a former police station. 10a-5p (Sat-Sun) | Free

SHOPPING & SIGHTSEEING

Sydney has many fantastic shopping areas, from the **DFO** (outlet mall in Homebush) to **Queen Victoria Building** and the Victorian **Strand Arcade** in the CBD. **Westfield Sydney** (a big modern mall) is in the base of the Sydney Tower (see below).

Sydney Tower Eye: Take in 360 degree views of the city from the viewing platform in Sydney Tower. Feeling brave? Step out on the Skywalk – Sydney's highest outdoor adventure. For something calmer, eat in the revolving restaurant. 10a-7p | \$20 (Skywalk: \$95)

BEACHES

Bondi Beach: Probably the most famous beach in Australia, certainly in Sydney. This lifeguarded (7a-5p) beach is very popular and gets busy. Good swimming, good sunbathing, good restaurants.

Lady Bay: Also known as Lady Jane, this nudist beach (popular with LGBT bathers) is found (rather amusingly) beneath a Royal Australian Navy facility.

Tamarama Beach: Known for its powerful surf, this is another LGBT hotspot in Australia's LGBT Capital. Nicknamed 'Glamarama', you'll need to be a strong swimmer to go out in to the water.
