WALKING TRAILS

Timaru district has over 30 walking and cycling trails to explore, for all abilities. Check out the full list.

Tuhawaiki (Jack's) Point, Timaru: Follow the coast to the historic Tuhawaiki (Jack's) Point Lighthouse. You might even see some seals or penguins on the rocky beach below. The More info

Huatakerekere/Little Mount Peel, Peel Forest: One of the best day-walks in Canterbury. About 10km track, but due to uphill climbs can take up to 9 hours. *® More info

Dashing Rocks, Timaru: Very close to the CBD, this popular walk can start (or end) with refreshing drinks on the Bay Hill overlooking Caroline Bay. The More info

Centennial Park, Timaru: A 65-hectare reserve with numerous trails on the outskirts of Timaru city. The south entrance also leads out towards the coast. The More info
